Where: Scott Township VFD, Lawrence County
When: Saturday, September 26, 2026 from 9 AM - 1 PM.
Accepts: Appliances, electronics, tires, batteries, HHW & fluorescent lights.
Notes: Registration required. Event details and materials accepted are subject to change.

Municipal Programs for Residents ONLY:

1. City of Sharon:

Residents of Sharon can drop off electronics at the City Garage, located at 77 East Budd Street, from 7:30 AM till Noon on the first & third Wednesday of every month. Acceptable items include TV's, computers, laptops, computer accessories, printers, and fax machines. Call 724-983-3238 for more information.

Municipal Programs for Residents ONLY:

2. **City of Farrell**: Residents of Farrell may contact the City's Public Works/Street Department at 724-983-2703 Extension 105 or 106 to make arrangements for the curbside pick-up of electronics, or schedule online at www.cityoffarrell.com/.
3. **City of Hermitage**: Residents of the City of Hermitage can take electronics to the City Garage located on Virginia Road for a \$20 tag per item. Collections are held on the first and third Friday of the month from 7 AM-12 PM. This program is for Hermitage residents ONLY and a valid photo ID must be presented. Contact Aiken at (724) 758-9400 or Hermitage at (724) 342-0210 with questions.
4. **Greenville Borough**: Residents of Greenville may call Tri-County Industries at 724-748-4705, Option 1, to set up an appointment for the collection of electronics and household hazardous waste. Tri-County offers the curbside pickup service to provide HHW & electronics collections for residents of Greenville Borough through a municipal contract.
5. **Grove City Borough**: Residents of Grove City have quarterly, curbside collection opportunities for electronics and HHW. Registration is required, one week in advance of the collection event. Visit nobleenviro.com, call 412-567-6566, or email info@nobleenviro.com to register. This program is included in the Borough's residential billing for trash service. Collection days are scheduled for March 17 June 16, September 15, and December 15, 2026.
6. **Jamestown Borough**: Contact the Waste Management Call Center at 1-800-449-7587 to set up a collection appointment for electronics and household hazardous waste (some limitations apply). WM offers the "At Your Door Special Collection" service to provide year-round HHW & electronics collections for residents of the Borough through a municipal contract.
7. **New Wilmington Borough**: Residents of New Wilmington Borough must call Tri-County Industries, two (2) weeks in advance, at 724-748-4705, Option 1, to set up an appointment for the collection of electronics and household hazardous waste. E-waste pickup: March 11 and September 2, 2026. HHW pickup: March 4 and September 16, 2026. Tri-County offers service for residents of New Wilmington Borough through a municipal contract.
8. **Sharpsville Borough**: Residents of Sharpsville can contact the Borough Office at 724-962-7896 to schedule an appointment for the drop-off of electronics. Fees apply.

Best Buy retail stores in Pennsylvania and Ohio accept up to three (3) items per household per day (including a limit of two TV's or computer monitors per household per day). Tube televisions smaller than 31" and flat panel TV/computer monitors smaller than 50" can be recycled for a fee of \$29.99 each. Customers in PA will be given a \$30 Best Buy gift card as reimbursement for the store drop-off fee. Acceptable items other than televisions and monitors are accepted at no cost

Accepts: Nearly anything electronic including computer accessories, cell phones, DVD players, satellite receivers, game consoles, tablets, etc.

Notes: No large or small kitchen appliances, microwaves, or console TV's. For a complete list visit bestbuy.com/recycling or call your local store.

2. Staples: **439 S Hermitage Road, Hermitage (724-342-0439)** **110 Moraine Pointe Plaza, Butler (724-282-1109)**

Accepts: Please see the attachment from Staples included in this guide. Staples accepts these items for FREE recycling and no fees apply.

Notes: No televisions, floor-model printers/copiers, lamps, bulbs, or home/kitchen appliances are accepted. For more information visit staples.com/stores/recycling or call your local store.

3. Lowes: **2640 West State Street, New Castle, Lawrence County (724-658-9588)** **3000 Glimcher Boulevard, Hermitage, Mercer County (724-983-5360)**

Accepts: Rechargeable batteries, plastic plant pots, & cell phones. Follow instructions at the Recycling Center, usually found near the front of the store.

Acceptability may change. Please call ahead.

Accepts: Televisions and computers.

2. **Valley Waste Transfer Station**: **261 Wallace Run Road, Beaver Falls, Beaver County.**

Hours: Monday- Friday from 8 AM—4:30 PM, Saturday from 8 AM– 11:30 AM.

Accepts: Televisions and computers.

Notes: Fees apply. Upon arrival, visit the dispatch office next to the scale for instructions. Call 724-843-9373 or visit valleywasteservice.com for more information.

Curbside Pick-up Service:

1. **Tri- County Industries (TCI)**: The curbside pick-up of electronics is available for residential customers of TCI in Pine, Liberty, and Springfield Townships, Mercer County. Appointments are required and fees apply. Call TCI at 724-748-4705 to to schedule a pick-up. Collections of televisions and computers are limited to three (3) items per year for eligible customers.

WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED IN STORE

Air conditioners, floor-model printers & copiers, home & kitchen appliances, lamps & bulbs, large servers, large speakers, medical devices, records & record players, scissors & other blades, smoke detectors, televisions or vaporizers.

Download the Staples® app to track your recycling, earn points with Easy Rewards™ and more.

Store management has the right to refuse to accept items that may pose a health or safety risk. When you recycle your eligible electronic device at Staples, you relinquish all ownership rights in the device when you give it to Staples to be recycled. Additionally, Staples is not responsible for any data left on the device turned in for recycling. You are solely responsible for removing data from your device, and you acknowledge that submission of a device for recycling is at your sole risk. When you give your device to Staples for recycling, you further represent that you either: (1) are the sole owner of the electronic device and of any data that was on the electronic device before you deleted all such data prior to recycling; or (2) have permission to proceed with recycling from all other owners of the electronic device or of any data that was on the electronic device before you deleted all such data prior to recycling.
